Exploring voice and language as well as notions of transformation and transposition, Violaine Lochu has developed an artistic practice at the crossroads of the visual arts, experimental music and sound poetry.

Her solo exhibition at La Criée, Pharmakon / Reboot unfolds around healing songs, gestures and thoughts. It is conceived as an ensemble in which video-performances, costume-partitions, drawing-writing, sound pieces and site-specific performances interact. How does art help us to resonate with ourselves and others? And to take care of those, and everything, around us? These questions, which have underpinned Violaine Lochu's work in recent years, are at the heart of the *Pharmakon / Reboot* exhibition. *Pharmakon* comes from the Greek and refers to both remedy and poison; *Reboot* in English means the restarting of a story or system, and in French evokes the 'rebouteux', the healer.

To prepare her exhibition, Violaine Lochu conducted research in several stages. She is interested in the interactions between humans and plants and in ancestral healing practices - from animist rituals to the knowledge of plants at the origin of pharmacopoeia. She went to meet herbalists, ethnobotanists and magnetisers in Mayenne, her native region. She then gathered the views of people living in and around Rennes, asking them a simple, straightforward question: what would you like to be cured of? Based on these exchanges, Violaine Lochu has composed new graphic and musical writings that open up a world of fictional possibilities

The songs of plants

These writings take shape in the *Pharmakon / Reboot* installation, comprising a video triptych and ten suspended textile works. Visitors are invited to take off their shoes and take a seat on the green carpet at the centre of the installation. The videos feature artist Violaine Lochu alongside two singer-performers, Yael Miller and Flor Paichard, dressed in costume-scores.

This vocal trio performs 'gestured songs', corresponding to the graphic scores embroidered on their capes. aprons and rugs. The titles of these textile works are the names of medicinal plants used in western France: mugwort, cabbage, St John's wort, plantain and elderberry. Violaine Lochu has studied their various properties: how they grow, their shapes, their colours, their therapeutic virtues and their symbolism, and transposed them into musical compositions. Flor Paichard wears and interprets the *Armoise* (Mugwort) cape (in red cotton), a plant recommended for blood circulation problems and whose symbolism is associated with fire and energy. Violaine Lochu, wearing the orange Millepertuis (St John's Wort) cape, vocally transcribes the air holes and bubbles of the plant. known for its antiseptic, anti-inflammatory and antidepressant properties.

The *Pharmakon / Reboot* exhibition borrows from local and distant indigenous knowledge, as well as being part of a recent history of performance art and ecofeminist practices. Violaine Lochu's work is also marked by her personal experiences, which have led her to study traditional songs in Bulgaria, Italy, Poland and Sweden, to live and work in Benin, and more recently to complete a residency in Vietnam. Encounters, exchanges and collaborations are at the heart of her creative process.

Healing vows and associated rituals

The exhibition has a strong ritual dimension, exploring the power of voice and song as healing rituals. In the second room, wearing headphones, visitors listen to a sound piece entitled chœur-corps-care

Yiolaine Lochu is particularly interested in the works of ecofeminist philosophers Emilie Hache and Jeanne Burgat-Goutal, and sociologist Fanny Charasse

(choir-body-care), featuring the whispered and intertwined voices of dozens of people recounting their ailments, without any hierarchy (serious/benign) or categorisation (psychological/physical). Brought together in a single breath, these voices with their unique stories seem to form a whole. Violaine Lochu has made around forty sound recordings, which she has also transcribed into writing-drawings called *Pharmakon / Reboot #vœux de guérison*, playing on notions of exposure/protection, revelation/retention, and legibility/illegibility. For their composition, she drew inspiration from the microscopic views of medicinal plant cells.

The exhibition opens on a collaborative note, inviting visitors to write their own wishes for healing then place them in the *Meubles à vœux #1 (Wishing Furniture #1)*.

Every week, members of the reception and mediation team become *Rebooters*. During weekly performances, they gather the wishes according to a protocol handed down and shared by Violaine Lochu. The wishes are read, rolled up, then placed and covered with water in the fourteen vases of the *Meubles à vœux #2*, located in the main hall.

The artist and the art centre are working together to experiment with new ways of exhibiting and transmitting, using bodies, gestures and voices over different timeframes. For the opening and closing of the exhibition, Violaine Lochu will give performances based on healing songs.

At the end of the exhibition, she will pour the water from the vases back onto the plants at Montaigu, in a final ritual.

Wishes addressed to plants

In *Pharmakon / Reboot #2*, Violaine Lochu invents a healing ritual by combining readings on ecofeminism^{*}, anthropology^{**} and philosophy^{***}, and her encounters with practitioners of both conventional and alternative medicine (magnetism, hypnosis, acupuncture).

This video-performance was filmed in Mayenne, at Montaigu, a hill where traces of rites practised since prehistoric times have been found. Three performers are engaged in an action related to plants: kneeling on coloured carpets (*Rebooters carpets*), embroidered with symbols inspired by floral diagrams ***, they read out healing wishes in a low voice. After dissolving the wishes in a vial of water, the three performers drink the contents before spitting them out onto the plants. The plants (holly, wild hyacinth, nettle, gorse, pine, etc.), chosen for their therapeutic virtues and symbolism, receive the wishes through the water on which they feed.

Songs of the scientists

In the small room, Violaine Lochu presents an earlier work, *HypnaGround* (2024), which extends the question of listening and rituals to all living things. This video-performance was produced in collaboration with researchers from the Mappa Lab environmental archaeology laboratory at the University of Pisa in Italy and video artist Makoto C. Friedmann. Inspired by the work of the anthropologists Bruno Latour, Nastassja Martin and Jeanne Favret-Saada, Violaine

Lochu invited archaeologists to explore the emotional, micro-political and unconscious relationships they have with their territory. After a week of research and filming in the Apuan Alps - involving discussions, vocal practice and hypnosis exercises - the archaeologists performed choral and solo songs in their research environments.

Scientific knowledge mingles with a sensitive and physical approach to the elements, merging into a variety of shared songs.

With *Pharmakon / Reboot*, Violaine Lochu lays bare her own voice to recompose, to make heard and to accompany our ills. The central questions addressed by the artist in this exhibition prompt others: How can modern and vernacular gestures and knowledge merge and complement each other? How can an exhibition welcome and listen? Can a work of art be both intimate and collective, poetic and political?

Pharmakon / Reboot offers a reflection on the decompartmentalisation of forms and practices - artistic, medical, social - made possible by the pooling of knowledge and the (re)invention of healing gestures. It invites us to listen, to feel and to pay attention to our environment, by creating bridges between contemporary and ancient, learned and vernacular, human and non-human worlds.


summer tours
